OLIVE RIDLEY TURTLE

- Olive Ridley Turtles are one of the seven different species of turtles found in India. They get their unique name because of the olive green coloured heart-shaped shell.
- Olive Ridleys have mass nesting, wherein hundreds of females come over to the beach where they were born to lay eggs in a nesting hole. This is known as Aribada in India (Odisha, Tamil Nadu). The hatchlings dig themselves out after 45-60 days.
- India's forest department officials guard turtle eggs from poachers, stray dogs by following a strict guideline to conserve these fantastic reptiles.



Do you know why these turtles cry? They have special glands in the corner of their eyes that separates the salt from the ocean water and this salt gets released with their tears.

THREATS

Bycatch in commercial fishing, poaching of eggs, depleting prey populations, habitat destruction and developmental activities on sea shores.
